Dear Parent/Carer,

Covid-19

Unfortunately, we have had a staff member test positive for the coronavirus this week and a number of students are out of school as a result of a student testing positive as well. I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that if a family member (parent, sibling or anybody else living in the family home) is presenting with Covid-19 symptoms, then students should stay at home while the family member goes through the testing process. Please ring us to let us know and we will mark your son as self-isolating, which will not count against their attendance.

Parents' Evenings

Now we have had our first online parents' evening (with Year 10), we are looking forward to the those which will take place in the first half term after the Christmas break. Whilst an online parents' event is unlike a traditional evening, it allows communication with a range of teachers over the evening. Year 13 parents' evening will take place on Thursday 21st January and Year 11 will have their parents' evening on Thursday 4th February. When the parents' evening for your son's year group is coming up, you will be contacted to explain how to make appointments and log on that evening.

Dress Code for Students Continues

I would not want our efforts to reduce Covid-19 infection to inadvertently result in students getting other infections such as colds, especially as we run up towards the Christmas break. It has been colder this week and some students are bringing coats to school which may not protect them completely from the cold or rain. Parents/carers are reminded that their sons should be wearing a black or navy coat ideally to school.

Act Early Campaign

Online Tutors – Keeping Children Safe (LGfL) Guidance for Parents & Carers

Private tutors are used by families to support children catching up with missed work or address areas they are struggling with, or with extra-curricular activities like music. Lockdown has led to major growth in this area, especially online. Anyone can set up as a tutor and there are no registration procedures. They do not even require an Enhanced DBS check. To help parents, LGfL has prepared a leaflet supporting parents to select the right person, establish clear rules and help the child understand what they should know too. Examinations 2021

There has been ongoing uncertainty around next year's examinations. Building on the three-week delay to examinations, the Government announced the following this week:

- more generous grading than usual, in line with national outcomes from 2020, so that students are not disadvantaged this year;
- students receiving advance notice of some topic areas covered in GCSE, AS and A levels to focus revision;
- examination aids like formula sheets provided in some exams giving students more confidence and reducing the amount of information they need to memorise;
- additional examinations to give students a second chance to sit a paper if the main exams or assessments are
 missed due to illness or self-isolation.
