You can either:

- Bring it to the school and post it in the ballot box in main reception or
- Arrange for your child to bring it to school and post it in the ballot box or
- Email your vote to <u>johnfisherschool@johnfisherschool.org</u> marking in the subject 'parent governor election'. Please put the name of your son in the email which will validate your vote.

Votes will be counted on Thursday 20 October and the result will be announced on Friday 21 October.
