# Dear Parents/Carers,

# COVID-19

We know how important it is for you to be able to send your son to school. We are taking a number of measures to help prevent the spread of the coronavirus, including:

- Encouraging all staff to test regularly to minimise the risk of transmission
- Ensuring our students and staff practice good hygiene
- Making sure our spaces are ventilated and we are expecting our CO2 monitors very soon
- Encouraging all members of our community to isolate and book a <u>PCR test</u> should they develop symptoms of the virus.

We are also asking you as parents/carers to encourage your son to test twice per week and to report each of those test results and help the school remain open. We have had six positive test results in Year 8, one in Year 9 and two in Year 10 this week. As a result of this, students in Year 8 are asked to wear face masks in class rooms and communal areas and will not be meeting together as a year group, from Monday up until half term in the first instance. Up to one in three people who have COVID-19 can spread the virus without knowing. This is because they have no symptoms. Please ask your son if he has received his test kit from his tutor and help him to take the test if necessary. The tests come with guidance in multiple languages on how to take the test. You can also view this useful video which shows you how to take the test. Tests usually take a few minutes to do and you get the results in 30 minutes. Please remember to record your son's test results onto the TestRegister platform.

If you are unable to work due to your child having, or displaying symptoms of, COVID-19, you may be entitled to a one-off payment of £500 through the <u>NHS Test and Trace Support Payment scheme</u> if you are required to stay at home and self-isolate. You will be eligible if you meet all the following criteria:

- you have been asked to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace, including by the NHS COVID-19 app
- you are employed or self-employed
- you cannot work from home and will lose income as a result
- you are claiming at least one of the following benefits:
  - 1. Universal Credit
  - 2. Working Tax Credits
  - 3. income-related Employment and Support Allowance
  - 4. income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
  - 5. Income Support
  - 6. Pension Credit or Housing Benefit
