International Women's Day

This Wednesday we celebrated **International Women's Day** as a whole school community. This year's theme was 'embracing equity'. Students engaged with this theme during Form worship, watching a video which explained the ways in which women have not been given equity historically, and more recent issues such as the gender pay gap. Thank you to Ms. Mozammel (Equality and Diversity Lead) for the resources and activities on the day.

Year 11 Pre Public Examination Results

Year 11 students received the raw scores from their second round of Pre-Public Examinations on Wednesday and their 'Professional Predictions' on Thursday. A raw score is the actual result based on whichever module/s were examined in his PPE2 papers. 'Professional Predictions' are the actual full grades which the students' teachers think they will receive in their actual public examinations this summer. On Friday, students will receive report comments from their child's teachers. On Tuesday 14 March Year 11 students will be completing a reflection booklet on both their raw scores and 'Professional Prediction' grades. Students been asked to share both their raw scores and professional prediction grades with their parents/carers. We will be asking for these booklets to be returned to Form tutors by Friday 24 March. A number of students and their parents/carers have been invited to school for a meeting after school on either Monday 13 March or Monday 27 March regarding their Pre-Public Examinations.

National Careers Week

It has also been **National Careers week**, with Mr. Palmer (Careers Lead) speaking to students during team meetings about the opportunities available within school, and outside. Supporting our school vision for 'Love of Learning', on Thursday evening we welcomed Year 9 students and parents/carers for a Key Stage 4 Pathways event, giving students the opportunity to find out more about the option subjects they might be interested in. Industrial Strike Action by the National Education Union (NEU), Wednesday 15 March & Thursday 16 March 2023: Days 3 & 4

As you will have read in one of my previous letters, there is national industrial strike action planned by the National Education Union for Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 March. As a result, there will only be restricted attendance for students who are considered vulnerable, any students completing assessments (30 selected Yr. 10 students on Wednesday 15 March from 9.00am to 2.00pm) and those who are in public examination groups as per the guidance from the Department for Education.
