IT Investment

You may remember that last year we ran a fundraising campaign to help support the school in its investment into key areas such as the boilers, IT server and Plough Lane. There has been some work completed over the summer on our pavilion at Plough Lane. The inside has been painted and some essential repairs have been carried out on the toilets and serving area. The focus for the remaining funds was IT across the school. We are very grateful to Peter Bennett (Alumni, 1969) who generously matched the remaining sum, which resulted in an investment of over £100,000 on IT this summer. As part of our 3 year plan, we now have new PCs in three IT suites, improved bandwidth and server speed, additional server space and improved infrastructure. We are determined to continue our work in this area and will be asking the JFA to support our investment this year.
