#### Covid Update

As you may have seen in the news, all Plan B measures will be removed in England, with a full return to Plan A, by Thursday 27th January. Face coverings are no longer recommended in classrooms and teaching spaces for staff and students in Year 7 and above. However, students and staff can continue to wearing face coverings if they wish to do so. From Thursday 27th January, face coverings will no longer be recommended in communal areas for staff and students.

#### Safeguarding Update

The UK Government has launched a new advice and support site to help keep children safe from sexual abuse. The site includes advice for parents and carers on spotting the signs of sexual abuse and speaking to your child about relationships and safety. It also signposts to sources of further support for children, adults and professionals, including the NSPCC helpline and Childline. This service has resources and suggestions. Unfortunately, a number of students from schools in the local area have been victims of muggings on public transport in the last few weeks. Please re-enforce the school's message to your son that their mobile phone or AirPods/earbuds etc are not worth getting hurt over. Please remind your son of the simple steps they can take to reduce the risk, such as: traveling in small groups, avoiding known problem areas (even if the safer route is slightly longer), travelling on the lower deck of the bus where possible etc. The most effective way of reducing the risk, is not to carry valuable items. Whilst students may want to have and wear the latest brands and phones, their clothing, phone or headphones will say a lot about how much cash or valuables they might be carrying. Where possible, students should be discouraged from bringing items of value to school.
