Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a busy week with Year 10 completing their Pre-Public examinations (PPEs), the Junior Maths Challenge and a number of GCSE and A Level revision workshops/revision sessions.



The week started with 9 of our students being recognised for their achievements and talents at the Sutton Jack Petchey Awards evening. As part of the Jack Petchey scheme, our staff nominate students every month for going above and beyond or for their achievements in academic, sporting or cultural activities. Students are also able to nominate staff members for the role they play in the success of The John Fisher School. This year, Mr. Paul received his award for his work in Media, supporting students and going above and beyond. Well done and congratulations to everyone involved!

Well done to the U13 Basketball team who played this week and have progressed to the semi-final of the NBA Schools Basketball Competition. They beat Bishop Thomas Grant School, having a 'behind closed doors' run out on our new Sports Hall floor. They will now play Whitgift School in the semi-final.

Congratulations to Aidan O (Year 10) who represented London and The John Fisher School in the Inter Divisional Championships. Aidan competed in the 100m and 200m Butterfly, as well as the Medley Relay. He won 2 of his 3 individual events (200m Butterfly and 100m Butterfly) and with his fellow London team mates secured bronze in the 4 x 100 Freestyle Relay. Even more impressively,



Aidan and his team mates won a gold medal and set a new championship record in the Medley Relay where he got the team off to a great start with his backstroke leg. Following these successes, Aidan has been selected to represent the ESSA England Schools' Swimming Team in the U15 World School Games taking place in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil this summer.

Industrial Strike Action by the National Education Union (NEU), Tuesday 2 May 2023

Due to an ongoing dispute on school funding, staff pay and conditions, another day of planned industrial action will take place nationally on Tuesday 2 May. I can appreciate how challenging a situation this is for teachers across the country, particularly when I know how committed The John Fisher School staff are to their roles, and know they do not take this decision lightly. Tuesday will mark the sixth day of this

academic year when striking staff members will lose pay as they campaign for an appropriate, fully funded pay rise.

As a result of this industrial strike action, there will be a partial opening for students who are considered vulnerable and those in public examination groups. Please see details below:
