Introduction

This policy statement sets out The John Fisher School's arrangements for managing the access of

providers to students at the school for the purposes of giving them information about the provider's education offer. This complies with our legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Student Entitlement

Students are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options evenings, assemblies, group discussions and taster events.
- To understand how make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

Careers education is delivered through subject areas, in the R.S.H.E. programme, in tutor time activities, via year group assemblies and events and key stage events, as well as whole school activities. We provide targeted activities for groups of pupils such as those who may be considering moving on to Further Education College, or those who need specific application support.

Parent consultations and reports allow for personalised conversations about pupil progress and target setting. Pupils are encouraged to have high aspirations and to be aware of the world of work from Year 7 onwards.

The 'Gatsby Benchmarks' are used as a measure of high-quality careers education. The school regularly evaluates progress against these benchmarks.

Gatsby Benchmarks:

- 1. A stable careers programme
- 2. Learning from career and labour market information
- 3. Addressing the needs of each pupil
- 4. Linking curriculum learning to careers
- 5. Encounters with employers and employees
- 6. Experiences of workplaces
- 7. Encounters with further and higher education
- 8. Personal guidance

Explicit Careers Lessons in the RSHE Curriculum

Careers-themed lessons are delivered as part of the whole-school RSHE programme. Lessons in KS3 and KS4 are fifty minutes long. Lessons in KS5 are delivered through the tutorial programme and in dedicated RSHE lessons. All class PowerPoints are available on the school system.
