### **Pupil Premium Report 2021/2022**

Pupil premium is additional funding from the Government to help the school to improve the attainment of disadvantaged students.

Evidence shows that children from disadvantaged background:

- generally face extra challenges in reaching their potential at school
- often do not perform as well as their peers
