Task 2:

Write an analysis of your chosen artwork. Use the Describe, Analyse, Interpret and Judge framework.

> You will have done something like this in class



When you describe an artwork, identify things in the work that you can see, name, and describe. Think of it as if you were trying to describe the work to a blind person

Analyse

When you analyze an artwork you will tell how the subject matter and elements of the work have been organized. To do this, think of the elements of art line, shape, form, and colour.

Interpret

Use the information from your description and analysis (and secondary sources like the internet) to help identify the meaning of the artwork

Judge

What is your conclusion? How well does it 'work'? How does the work awaken your imagination or help you feel a part of the work?

Task 3: Colour Pencil rendering of a sweet wrapper.



- You are to select a sweet / crisp wrapper and create a detailed colour pencil drawing of the wrapper filling your page.
- This can either be the whole wrapper or using a technique we call cropping selecting part of the wrapper and focussing just on this.
- Do pay attention to your use of line, proportion, scale and colour.
- Do pay attention to the shadows and reflected light on the wrapper as this will make it look more three dimensional.
- (In the image of the M&M's (right) the artist has cropped the image to just focus on the package lettering and details of the wrapper and sweets).

Create your own version of your chosen artwork.

For your own version, you could create a Pop Art inspired image, thinking about the following themes:

- A still life of objects at home.
- Your own version of a can or everyday kitchen object in the style of Andy Warhol.
- A picture inspired by a cartoon/ anime character.

Think carefully about the following:

- The use of line.
- The use of **proportion.**
- The use of composition (i.e. the layout the foreground (front) and the background)
- The use of colour.

Challenge tasks – independent research skills:



- •You could chose two artworks to compare and contrast.
- •You could do additional research about the artist and find some more examples of their work.
- •Could you find an article and youtube video about the artist? How could this help your analysis of the artwork?
- •Could you experiment with the same materials that the artist uses? How could be inspired by their techniques?
